SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE FILES

Files of Robert Hurner, Mondale's special assistant in his Minneapolis office, relating to schedules for Mondale's Minnesota visits, and to casework and issues concerning Minnesota constituents. They include correspondence with Mondale's Washington, D.C. office staff and Democratic Party personnel, several single-issue files on higher profile or complex cases, and a file on local reaction to the 1975 federal Child and Family Services Bill. Also present are Hurner's 1978 casework files from Mondale's Vice-Presidential tenure, when his title was "special assistant for Minnesota constituents."
