S. 2426 To revise the Federal election laws, to prevent corrupt practices in Federal elections....

S. 372 To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to relieve broadcasters of the equal time requirement of section 315 with respect to presidential and vice presidential candidates and to amend the Campaign Communications Reform Act to provide a further limitation on expenditures in elections campaigns for Federal elective office.

- S. 16 To provide for a nationwide Presidential primary ... and to limit Federal campaign contributions and expenditures to the year in which a Federal election is held.
- S. 21 To terminate public financing of Presidential campaigns.
- S. 217 To prohibit political parties from engaging in credit card solicitation.
- S. 623 To provide for the public financing of general elections for the United States Senate; and for other purposes.
- S. 704 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to extend the statute of limitations to a period of 4 years.
- S. 714 To prohibit contributions by certain multicandidate political committees to candidates in elections for Federal office; and for other purposes.
- H.R. 69 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to provide that ... no expenditure may be made by any candidate or political committee unless there are sufficient funds in the checking account maintained by such committee to pay the amount of such expenditure and all other checks draws on such account and unpaid, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 125 To establish a series of six regional Presidential primaries....
- H.R. 364 To amend title 39, United States Code, to prohibit certain franked mailings by Members of Congress during certain periods before elections.
- H.R. 564 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to provide for financing of general election campaigns for the House of Representatives.
- H.R. 990 To amend and revise provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 relating to nonprofit organizations, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 1169 To provide for the regulation of State Presidential primary elections.
- H.R. 1783 To amend section 304 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 with respect to waiver of certain quarterly reports filed with the Federal Election Commission.
- H.R. 1904 To require that direct Presidential primary elections be held throughout the United States on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May of each presidential election year.
- H.R. 2221 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to provide for financing of general election campaigns for the House of Representatives, and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 to provide a tax credit for political contributions to candidates for Congress which is more limited than the existing tax for such contributions.
- H.R. 2340 To prohibit political parties from engaging in credit card solicitations.
- H.R. 2357 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, to provide free radio and television time to candidates for election to Federal office.
- H.R. 2400 To amend title 39, United States Code, to restore to Postal Service employees their rights to participate voluntarily, as private citizens, in the political processes of the Nation, to protect such employees from improper political solicitations, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 2401 To amend title 5, United States Code, to restore to Federal civilian employees.... [same as 2400].
- H.R. 2849 To provide for limitations on congressional campaign expenditures and for partial public financing of congressional primary and general elections.
- H.R. 3430 To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to prohibit Members of Congress from accepting any honorarium ... in excess of \$500.
- H.J.Res.37 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to give citizens of the United States the right to enact and repeal laws by voting on legislation in a national election.
